Student Complaint Process Information

In order to comply with the Higher Education Opportunities Act of 2008, the University of Connecticut (University) provides prospective and enrolled students with contact information for filing complaints with the University, its accrediting agency and with the appropriate state agencies.

The University of Connecticut

- **Discrimination**: For the resolution of all types of unlawful discrimination and discriminatory harassment complaints that fall within the purview of the Office of Diversity and Equity for any employee, student, applicant for admission or employment, or other participant in programs or activities of the University who believes she/he has been unlawfully discriminated against or harassed. - Final Grade Complaints: The University Senate By-laws describe the process for appeals of final course grades. The procedure can be found at https://catalog.uconn.edu/undergraduate/academic-regulations/#text.
- Disability Discrimination: Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act states, in Part 5, "that no otherwise qualified disabled individual shall solely by reason of such disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in programs or activities sponsored by a public entity." The purpose of this produces is to attempt to resolve all types of complaints at the level where they can occur in a timely manner.
